Reason for Amendment

Under current requirements, in cases where a laid-up ship re-enters into service, it is specified that the next scheduled periodical survey assigned prior to the ship being laid-up is to be carried out, even if the due date for such a survey does not pass while the ship is laid-up. Therefore, for example, in cases where a ship is laid-up for a few months after its fourth annual survey, a special survey is required upon re-entering service. This is an unpractical requirement.

Accordingly, the requirements on re-entering for a laid-up ship have been amended in order to specify the requirements in accordance with the laid-up period.

Outline of Amendment

The requirements on re-entering for laid-up ships in the Rules for the Survey and Construction of Steel Ships Part B, the Rules for High Speed Craft; the Rules for the Survey and Construction of Passenger Ships, and the Rules for Marine Pollution Prevention Systems have been amended. With respect the Rules for Safety Equipment, etc., requirements on re-entering for laid-up ships have been added.
